again this morning and as a result the lights were not flashing. I rang the 131700 number and reported it. I also asked them to get someone to check the safety switch and/or the transformer, as this is the third time it has happened.

Could you please follow up and make sure it is checked out properly, as it is affecting the apparent reliability of the lights.

I note that the earth leakage switch only detects conditions between it and the transformer, not from the transformer to the sign or on the sign itself as that is completely isolated from the safety switch by the transformer. Thus the problem cannot be with my controller.
